We are sure that you will find your year in the Prelude Strings a rewarding time, as we solidify the fundamentals of string technique while preparing music for our scheduled concerts. **If for any reason you are NOT planning to participate in the Albuquerque Prelude String Orchestra this year**, please call the AYS Program office at 875-1319 by July 1. This courtesy on your part will allow students on the waiting list the opportunity to perform with Prelude Strings. **Please read the enclosed tuition form carefully and note the important deadlines.**

#### First Rehearsal

The Albuquerque Prelude String Orchestra will have its student and parent orientation on Saturday, August 15, 2009, from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Parents, plan to attend the entire two hours of this important orientation, which will include a short rehearsal (students, bring your instrument!) so that you may meet the instructors and staff that will be working with your child each week. You will also get an overview of what your child can expect each week, and in turn, what we expect from your child. The Albuquerque Prelude String Orchestra will rehearse at the Public Academy for Performing Arts (PAPA) every Saturday that Albuquerque Public Schools is in session unless otherwise announced. Please refer to the schedule on the back of this letter and enter the dates on your calendar. Please note that the rehearsal on August 22 will be "PRELUDE CAMP" from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. More information about Prelude Camp will be given during the Aug. 15 orientation.

South on San Mateo to Indian School Rd., turn west. We're on the north side of the street, immediately next to Congregation B'Nai Israel. Use the westernmost entrance to the parking lot, and follow the signs to the back of the complex.

#### Requirements for Participation in the AYS Program

The AYS Program is an enhancement to, and not a substitute for, existing school music programs, each of which has independent rules and policies. The AYS Program will coordinate activities with school programs as appropriate, but will neither interfere with, nor participate in establishing the rules or policies of, any school music program. Dismissal from any public or private school will be viewed as a failure to participate in school band or orchestra and will result in dismissal from the AYS Program.

Students must be enrolled as regular members of their school band or orchestra, if offered. Students accepted into the program on a string instrument (violin, viola, cello, string bass and harp) must be enrolled in their school orchestra. Home School students who also elect to attend a public school are subject to the same AYS Program membership requirements as public school students.

A list of students will be sent to all Music Directors and/or Orchestra Directors verifying appropriate participation according to the AYS Program policy in your school instrumental music program. If your school has no instrumental program, the school principal must sign this sheet, indicating that no instrumental program is offered.

#### Transportation

In the past, car-pooling has been a very effective and cooperative way to meet transportation needs. Students from each school generally make arrangements with each other. There will be an address and
