Congratulations and welcome to what I hope will be a WONDERFUL year as members of the Albuquerque Youth Symphony. The first order of business is to prepare for camp and our first concert. Please note that there will be a meeting of AYS Parents on Tuesday, August 3 at 5:30 p.m. at the AYS Montgomery Complex. We will have information about the annual AYS Tour at this meeting, so plan on attending.**

Hummingbird Camp for AYS

For the 33rd year this summer, our music camp will be held at the Hummingbird Music Camp in Jemez, New Mexico on August 4 - 7, 2010. The camps have been tremendously successful in upholding the musical standards of the groups as well as providing the opportunity to make new acquaintances and improve individual musical abilities. The AYS has our first concert scheduled in September, so your attendance at camp is required. If you are not able to attend camp, you must contact me at the AYS Program office and ask to be excused.

This summer's camp will provide us the opportunity to prepare many of our year's activities. In addition to preparing the September concert music, we will elect student officers, organize various ensembles, prepare fund-raising activities, fold luminaria bags, become well acquainted, and in general, get as ready as possible for a wonderful and exciting year. We all need to make the positive kind of commitment to each other and ourselves that will make for another great orchestra.

In order to make definite plans for camp, we will need a commitment by receiving the "Permission to Participate" form and tuition deposit from each student by **July 9, 2010** (If you are applying for financial aid, the deadline is also **July 9, 2010**).

AYS CAMP/GENERAL INFORMATION

1. **You must pick up your folder of music we will be playing on the first concert at Robertson & Sons Violin Shop (3201 Carlisle NE) between July 6 and July 10.** It is expected that as a part of the honor and commitment to the standards of AYS that your individual part has been prepared before the first rehearsal. Camp is for rehearsing—while there will be professional coaches to help you, **LEARNING THE NOTES IS EXPECTED BEFORE CAMP.** In summary, what this means is that you bring to the first rehearsal the music prepared up to tempo with right notes, correct rhythms, key signatures, clef and transposition changes, where applicable, and attention to all editings such as bowings, articulations and dynamics.
2. Wednesday, August 4 - Report to **Sandia High School** (7801 Candelaria NE) in the North parking lot by 11:15 a.m. You will be provided free bus transportation to Hummingbird (NO lunch is served on arrival so bring sack lunch if you wish). **IF you are going to arrive at Hummingbird by other means of transportation, we need to hear from a parent - please call the AYS office (875-1319) by July 19.**

3. Saturday, August 7 - Camp is over after lunch and the concert. You are responsible for arranging your own transportation back to Albuquerque. The Albuquerque Youth Symphony Parents Association will be inviting parents to bring a picnic lunch to eat with us at noon. Following lunch we will play a short concert for the parents, providing an opportunity for everyone to get acquainted. We will depart for home around 1:30 p.m.
4. **The following students will appear on informal solo recitals during camp:**
Aiden Anderson, Hailey Buster, Grace Cornelius, Megan Dunlap, Sophia Li, Andrew Lin, Nick Perich, Dylan Reames, Linnea Rowley, Rachel Schlesinger and the percussion ensemble. The AYS Program will provide an accompanist for the recitals. Please bring your accompaniment part to the AYS Program office no later than July 16.
5. Be sure to take these supplies to Hummingbird Camp:
Sleeping bag and pillow, soap, shampoo and wash cloth, light jacket or sweater, flashlight, extra strings and rosin, reeds and valve oil (as applicable). **REMEMBER** to bring a folding stand and pencil to camp! Eligibility

All students accepted into the AYS program must make sure they meet the eligibility requirements.

The AYS Program is an enhancement to, and not a substitute for, existing school music programs, each of which has independent rules and policies. AYS Program will coordinate activities with school programs as appropriate, but will neither interfere with, nor participate in establishing the rules or policies of, any school music program. Dismissal from any public or independent school will be viewed as a failure to participate in school band or orchestra and will result in dismissal from the AYS Program.

Students must be enrolled as regular members of their school band or orchestra, if offered. Students accepted into the Program on a string instrument (violin, viola, cello, string bass and harp) must be enrolled in their school orchestra. Students who are accepted into the Program on a woodwind, brass or percussion instrument must be enrolled in their school band. Home School students who also elect to attend a public school are subject to the same AYS Program membership requirements as public school students.

A list of students will be sent to all Music Directors, Orchestra Directors and Band Directors verifying appropriate participation according to AYS Program policy in your school instrumental music program. If your school has no instrumental program, the school principal must sign this sheet, indicating that no instrumental program is offered.

All students must meet the grade point requirements for extracurricular eligibility. If you have just graduated from the 8th grade, you may not be aware that at the end of this year you must have at least a 2.0 grade point and cannot have failed two (2) classes. Other AYS Program regulations are listed in the AYS Program Handbook which is available on our website at www.aysmusic.org. If you have any questions about this, please call the office as soon as possible and definitely before camp.

Behavior Expectations for all AYS Program Students

Reasonable standards of behavior and dress are expected while rehearsing, performing, or participating in any event or activity associated with the Albuquerque Youth Symphony Program. For more detail, please see the AYS Program Handbook at www.aysmusic.org.

1. Demonstrate appropriate, respectful behavior toward AYS Program staff, fellow students and at all performance and rehearsal venues.

2. Do not talk while your conductor is speaking. **All electronic devices, including cell phones, should be turned off and put away during rehearsals and concerts.**
3. Use facilities properly, remaining only in the areas assigned to your orchestra (i.e., please do not wander the halls), keeping the buildings clean and displaying mature, appropriate behavior at all times.
4. All forms of tobacco, alcohol and controlled substances are strictly forbidden at all AYS Program events and activities.
